Section 4 : First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

Inhalation : Product does not contain volatile substances. If spray or mist has been inhaled, move affected person to fresh air, keep warm and at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

Ingestion : Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Give patient water to drink. Get medical attention immediately.

Eye Contact : Rinse immediately with plenty of clean water for 15 mins. Remove any contact lenses. Get medical attention immediately. Continue rinsing.

General Information

Symptoms will vary in severity dependent on the concentration and length of exposure.

Skin Contact : Prolonged contact may cause irritation and redness.

Eye Contact : Irritating to the eyes causing redness and pain.

Notes for doctor : Treat symptomatically.
